The Search Process

The Board of Education of the Rancocas Valley Regional High School District, Burlington County, is initiating a search for a Superintendent to serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Board of Education in accordance with the Board policies and New Jersey Statutes.

The Board of Education has retained the New Jersey Association of School Administrators (NJASA) as a consultant to assist in the selection of candidates to find an exceptional leader to follow in the tradition of excellence expected by this great regional school district and the Board of Education.

The Rancocas Valley Regional HS Superintendent position will be available on January 1, 2026. The successful candidate will assume the position on January 1, 2026 or later pursuant to other contractual obligations.

The Community

The Rancocas Valley Regional High School (RVRHS) District serves five sending districts covering approximately 40 square miles in Burlington County: Eastampton, Hainesport, Lumberton, Mount Holly and Westampton. RVRHS is situated on a picturesque campus in Mount Holly, the county seat.

The sending communities represent a mix of small towns, rural areas and some of the fastest growing suburban developments in the region. RVRHS meets the educational needs of a diverse student body of approximately 2000 students in grades nine through twelve, who are empowered learners valuing Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Diversity, and Excellence – RV P.R.I.D.E.

The School District

Rancocas Valley Regional fulfills its mission to create empowered learners by supporting the belief that learning is a lifelong process, that all students can learn, and that through high expectations and active participation, they will attain a high level of achievement. The entire school community expects – and has a right to – a safe, supportive environment in a well-maintained facility. The RVRHS Board of Education, administration, and staff, encourage parents/guardians to be active participants in their children's education. Working together, the entire school community is responsible for the academic, social, and emotional growth of the students.

RVRHS offers a range of courses and programs to meet the needs of every student to prepare them for success beyond high school. Our rigorous college preparatory, honors and advanced placement courses prepare students for the demands and rewards of college as they pursue undergraduate and advanced degrees.

The district is recognized for innovative programs for students who are pursuing careers in the trades or will enter the armed services upon graduation. Rancocas Valley Regional's acclaimed ROTC program prepares students for successful military careers or as a step toward college or a related career. A self-contained multiple disabilities program – F.L.I.P. (Functional Life Skills Integrated Program) bolsters the confidence by giving students an opportunity to focus on functional academic life skills, daily living skills, prevocational/vocational skills, social interactions and a chance to improve overall academic potential.

A full range of extracurricular activities including robotics, creative and performing arts, and environmental sciences as well as a challenging athletic program, round out the district's curriculum.

Rancocas Valley Regional High School's block schedule provides students with a more enriching academic experience, enabling them to take four, seventy-two-minute courses each day, during each eighteen-week semester. The two semesters enable students to pursue eight courses (four per semester) each year.

During the 2024-2025 school year Rancocas Valley offered 20 AP courses in a variety of content areas, and we encourage students to challenge themselves. RVRHS strives for an inclusive program characterized by open access to advanced placement courses, aligned with the district's mission and vision. Additionally, Rancocas Valley Regional partners with New Jersey colleges and universities to offer an opportunity for students enrolled in select courses to earn both high school and college credit under the College Accelerated Program (CAP). CAP partners include RCBC, Seton Hall, Stockton, Fairleigh Dickinson, and TCNJ.

RVRHS participates and, in May 2014 was nationally certified in Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Pathway to Engineering program. The Pathway to Engineering program provides students interested in pursuing a career in engineering, biomechanics, aeronautics, or other applied math/science areas with an opportunity to experience real-world, hands-on learning.
